Development Milestones: 3–4 Years

Parents of children 3–4 Years

Milestones that reflect the growing independence, conversation skills, and social play typical of the preschool years.

Movement

- ☐ Hops and balances briefly on one foot
- ☐ Pedals a tricycle confidently
- ☐ Climbs stairs with alternating feet

Language

- ☐ Speaks in full sentences of 4+ words
- ☐ Asks lots of "why" and "how" questions
- ☐ Tells a simple story about something that happened

Social & Emotional

- ☐ Plays cooperatively with other children
- ☐ Takes turns in games with some reminders
- ☐ Begins to understand and follow simple rules

Early Academic

- ☐ Recognizes some letters or numbers
- ☐ Draws a person with two or more body parts
- ☐ Counts a small group of objects
